NOTICE

YOU MAY BE ELIGIBLE FOR A REDUCTION ON YOUR CITY PROPERTY TAX AND WATER RATES

With certain household income limitations, you may be eligible for a reduction on your city property tax and water rates during fiscal year 2024. (Beginning July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2024)

The household income, excluding Social Security and disability pension, is limited to:

Single Applicant: \$20,000

Married Applicants: \$25,000 (combined income)
Household: \$25,000 (total household income)

You may be eligible if you were 65 years of age or a disabled resident on SSI and have owned your current residence for one (1) year, by December 31, 2022, and your income does not exceed the limits above.

You must submit the following documents with your application:

- Copy of Federal Tax Form (1040) for 2022. If you do not file a Federal Tax Form, you must submit: a copy of 2022 Social Security Benefit Statements, a copy of 2022 interest statements, and a copy of 2022 pension statements if applicable.
- Proof of income for all household residents over 18 years old
- Certificate of Insurance Award if disabled
- Proof of age and address (Matching items 1-3 above) should be presented. These include Picture ID, License, or Birth Certificate for homeowner applying for discount.

Applications for Exemptions are available at Town Hall. If you need assistance filling out the application, please feel free to stop by Town Hall, and we will be glad to assist you.

Office hours are Monday through Friday from 8:30AM to 4:30PM

PLEASE NOTE: This application form <u>and</u> the required documents must be submitted $\underline{\text{EVERY}}$ $\underline{\text{YEAR}}$ to demonstrate continued eligibility.

ELECTION INFORMATION

QUALIFICATIONS FOR MAYOR AND COUNCILPERSON

Any qualified voter of the City of Delaware City

- 1. Who is a qualified voter at least eighteen (18) years of age.
- 2. The "qualified voter" as used herein shall mean a person who is a registered voter with State of Delaware at the time that his/her nominating petition is filed.
- 3. Who is a United States Citizen.
- 4. Who has not been convicted of a felony as that crime is designated by the State of Delaware.
- 5. Who has established one (1) year residency in the City at the time their nominating petition is filed by furnishing identification and proof of residency.

ELECTION VOTER QUALIFICATIONS

Every person:

- 1. Who maintains their permanent place of residence within the City limits of Delaware City.
- 2. Who has reached the age of eighteen (18) years.
- 3. Who is a citizen of the United States.
- 4. Who is registered to vote under the State of Delaware's voter registration system maintained by the Department of Elections at least thirty (30) days prior to the date of the Election.
- 5. Who can prove the foregoing information by proper identification.

You can register to vote at <u>Ivote.de.gov</u> and follow the instructions to register to vote. If you do not have a computer, you can come to Town Hall, 407 Clinton Street, during normal business hours (Mon-Fri 8:30-4:30) and we will help you register.

The Delaware City Tree Commission: Trees – How they benefit you!

· Trees clean the air -

Trees absorb odors and pollutant gases (nitrogen oxides, ammonia, sulfur dioxide and ozone) and filter particulates out of the air by trapping them on their leaves and bark.

Trees provide Oxygen –

In one year an acre of mature trees can provide enough oxygen for 18 people.

· Trees cool the streets and city -

Average temperatures in Los Angeles have risen 6°F in the last 50 years as tree coverage has declined and the number of heat-absorbing roads and buildings has increased. Trees cool the city by up to 10°F, by shading our homes and streets, breaking up urban "heat islands" and releasing water vapor into the air through their leaves.
