NOTICE

YOU MAY BE ELIGIBLE FOR A REDUCTION ON YOUR CITY PROPERTY TAX RATES

With certain household income limitations, you may be eligible for a reduction on your city property tax rates during fiscal year 2025. (Beginning July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025)

The household income, excluding Social Security and disability pension,

is limited to:

Single Applicant: \$20,000

Married Applicants: \$25,000 (combined income)

Household: \$25,000 (total household income)

You may be eligible if you were 65 years of age or a disabled resident on SSI and have owned your current residence for one (1) year, by December 31, 2023, and your income does not exceed the limits above.

You must submit the following documents with your application:

1. Copy of Federal Tax Form (1040) for 2023.

If you do not file a Federal Tax Form, you must submit: a copy of 2023 Social Security
Benefit Statements, a copy of 2023 interest statements,
and a copy of 2023 pension statements if applicable.

2. Proof of income for all household residents over 18 years old
3. Certificate of Insurance Award if disabled

4. Proof of age and address (Matching items 1-3 above) shall be presented. These include Picture ID, License, or Birth Certificate for homeowner applying for discount.

Applications for Exemptions are available at Town Hall. If you need assistance filling out the application, please feel free to stop by Town Hall, and we will be glad to assist you. Office hours are Monday through Thursday from 9:00AM to 4:00PM and Fridays 9:00AM-1:00PM

PLEASE NOTE: This application form <u>and</u> the required documents must be submitted EVERY YEAR to demonstrate continued eligibility.

Delaware City Tree Commission



In 2024, (based on funds we receive/find) the tree commission will plant trees outside of the "main" streets, moving into side streets, Harbor Estates, and other areas in town to help add shade and beauty with appropriately sized trees avoiding future damages. The Tree Commission will be selecting trees that are the appropriate size for the planting location. Smaller trees for areas between street and sidewalks to eliminate sidewalk damage in the future. Larger trees for park areas. You can help increase tree cover and diversity of tree species, by planting a tree/shrub in your property. Now is a good time to decide where you'd like to plant a tree in your own yard. Looking for shade in the summer - plant deciduous (drops all leaves in fall). Looking for a windbreak, shade all year, green color all year - plant evergreen (keeps leaves like pine, magnolia, etc.).

Planting trees helps increase our tree cover, diversity of ecosystem, pollution control, value and beauty of the city and your home. Planting location, surrounding area, walks, potential construction, planting site all help determine which tree is best suited for that location. Use this list as a guide for your own tree planting. If everyone plants something different, it helps increase diversity making it a better ecosystem for all. If a disease/insect attacks one type of tree, then we still have many others that will survive.

Trees that the Delaware City Tree Commission and DE State Forestry have approved as city trees.

How do you decide which tree? If you're planting a new tree, find out how large it will be at maturity. The rule of thumb is to <u>plant the tree</u> as far from the house as its height at maturity. This will not only protect your foundation, it will protect your house if the tree falls in a storm.

Will tree roots break pipes and foundations?

Roots are not strong enough to "drill or break into" pipes. If there is an existing leak, roots will seek out the water and grow into the already existing crack. If you tie a rope around a tree, it will not "break" the rope. In fact the rope limits the growth of the tree (Please remove ropes, lights, etc to keep a tree healthy). The tree doesn't have that "strength" or power to break ropes, sealed pipes, or solid house foundations.

Although it is possible for tree roots to affect freestanding walls, they are far less likely to cause direct damage to house foundations as the resisting force is so much greater than anything the root can exert. When roots meet a solid object they tend to grow laterally, rather than downwards. Roots will also seek out and follow moisture from any source, including the condensation naturally created on the outside walls of a building.

ELECTION INFORMATION

QUALIFICATIONS FOR MAYOR AND COUNCILPERSON

Any qualified voter of the City of Delaware City

- 1. Who is a qualified voter at least eighteen (18) years of age.
- 2. The "qualified voter" as used herein shall mean a person who is a registered voter with State of Delaware at the time that his/her nominating petition is filed.
 - 3. Who is a United States Citizen.
 - 4. Who has not been convicted of a felony as that crime is designated by the State of Delaware.
- 5. Who has established one (1) year residency in the City at the time their nominating petition is filed by furnishing identification and proof of residency.

ELECTION VOTER QUALIFICATIONS

Every person:

- 1. Who maintains their permanent place of residence within the City limits of Delaware City.
 - 2. Who has reached the age of eighteen (18) years.
 - 3. Who is a citizen of the United States.
- 4. Who is registered to vote under the State of Delaware's voter registration system maintained by the Department of Elections at least thirty (30) days prior to the date of the Election.
 - 5. Who can prove the foregoing information by proper identification.

You can register to vote at <u>Ivote.de.gov</u> and follow the instructions to register to vote. If you do not have a computer, you can come to Town Hall, 407 Clinton Street, during normal business hours (Mon-Fri 8:30-4:30) and we will help you register.
