




EBENEZER UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

DELAWARE CITY BUSINESS LICENSE APPLICATIONS

Business License Applications and Fees are due by December 30, 2022

Any business failing to return all required documentation and payment by the due date shall be subject to a fine of \$100 per day. Delaware City Code Section 51-14 Violations and Penalties: Whoever shall violate any provisions of this article shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$100.00 each day that a business, occupation or activity is carried on, prosecuted, conducted or engaged in without a proper license having been obtained pursuant to this article or any other applicable law shall be deemed to be a separate offense.

STORMWATER



As storm water runoff flows over land surfaces—pavements, yards, driveways, and roofs—it picks up debris, chemicals, dirt, and other pollutants. Anything that enters a storm sewer system is discharged untreated into the waterbodies we use for swimming, fishing, and providing drinking water. Polluted runoff is the nation's greatest threat to clean water. In efforts to control storm water pollution, we must consider individual, household, and public behaviors and activities that can stop pollution from these surfaces. Here are some common individual behaviors you can do to help prevent storm

- * Always pick up your doggie's doo! Doggie doo can wash into our streams and rivers and introduce disease-causing bacteria.
- * Pick up litter from your yard and storm drains.
- * Use natural products whenever possible! Toxic substances like insect sprays and moth balls should be used as little as possible
- * Plant more trees and flowers! It will make your yard more beautiful, and make it more difficult for chemicals to reach waterways.
- * Recycle as much as possible!

water pollution:

- * Check your vehicle for oil leaks and drips on a regular basis. When you find a leak, fix it promptly.
- * Collect oil in containers with a tight fitting lid. Old milk jugs are perfect!
- * Never dump motor oil, antifreeze or other engine fluids down the storm drain or into the ground.
- * Wash your car at a car wash that filters water, this will prevent oil from your car from entering the ground water
- Use ground cloths under your vehicle whenever doing engine repair. Clean up all spills that happen in a timely matter.
 It takes everyone doing their part to control pollution.
 Only rain down the drain!



Preventing Thefts from Vehicles

Lock Your Doors



Keep Your Vehicle Tidy

Thieves like to window shop! Avoid leaving anything visible in the car. Almost any item that's visible from the outside - even if you think it is worthless - could be seen as valuable to a thief. Your spare change, sunglasses, even an empty bag (a thief may think there is something inside the bag) could be valuable in the mind of a thief.

Conceal All Belongings

Stow your electronics and accessories out of sight, or just take them along with you. Items such as power cords, adapters, and windshield suction-cup mounts may pique the interest of thieves. If you remove the suction cup, make sure to wipe the ring off the windshield; it's a dead giveaway valuable items may be inside the vehicle.

Conceal Before You Park

Get in the habit of putting items you want hidden in the trunk of your car before you arrive at your destination. Thieves will linger in busy parking lots looking for you to stash your valuable items.

Park Smar

Park in a busy, well-lit area and avoid concealment from larger vehicles, fences, or foliage. Avoid parking in isolated and poorlylit areas.

Report Break-Ins and Suspicious Activity

If you see a break-in in progress or subject(s) looking into cars, call 911 immediately! Provide the 911 dispatcher with as much information as possible, such as:

- **Location** provide an address, block number, or specific location in a parking lot. Describe vehicle that was targeted
- Description of Suspect Provide as much information as you can, i.e. sex, race, age, height, weight/build, hair color, facial hair, headwear, clothing description/color, and any identifying characteristics such as tattoos and/or piercings
- **Direction of Travel** provide an accurate direction of travel, using landmarks if needed. Give method of travel on foot, bicycle, vehicle describing color, make, model, and license plate number if safe to obtain

REGISTER YOUR PETS!

The Delaware city police department would like to encourage those with pets to register them with our department.

Often times our officers will receive notice of pets at large or have citizens bring them to our HQ after their recovery.

The pet registry allows our officers to return these beloved animals to their proper owners without the involvement of animal services. All you need to do is provide us with the name of your pet, the owners name, address and phone number and a picture of the pet in question.

If you don't have a photo, we would be glad to take one for you!

This service has already assisted us in returning several pets to their owners!

Pick up your free Vial of L.I.F.E. at the library! The Vial of L.I.F.E program is a free service provided by New Castle County Emergency Medical Services to all seniors and disabled residents of New Castle County. Vials inform paramedics on medications and health concerns of emergency service patients.
